Dear Prospective Applicant:

The Dixie National Forest is making the following changes in the Prospectus for Campground and Related Granger-Thye Concessions on the Dixie National Forest to address corrections, answer questions, and to clarify information.

Errata 1-1

Page 20 of the Prospectus, White Bridge CG, Minimum Operating Season

Remove: "Mid May to October 30"

Replace with: "Friday of Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day"

Errata 1-2

Page 24 of the Prospectus, Pine Lake CG, Minimum Operating Season

Remove: "Mid May-Snowfall"

Replace with: "Friday of Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day"

Errata 1-3

Page 33 of the Prospectus, Pass Discounts

"The following is a list of sites covered by this prospectus where the 50 percent discount for passes applies:"

"Pine Valley Recreation Area:"

Delete: "Day Use/Picnic Areas"

Errata 1-4

Prospectus, Appendix 9 Sample Annual Operating Plan, 5d2. Toilets

Remove: "When a toilet vault becomes $\frac{3}{4}$ full, complete pumping is required. Pumping is required at close of each season, including the final year of the permit."



Replace with: “When a toilet vault becomes $\frac{3}{4}$ full, complete pumping is required. Complete pumping is required for all vaults the final year of the permit.

“As a minimum, the septic tanks at Navajo Lake CG, Spruces CG, and Te-ah CG shall be pumped annually at the end of each season, including the final year of the permit. Pumping may be necessary more frequently than once per year.”

Questions and Clarifications through August 13, 2018

Question 1: Prospectus, page 30, states “There are sewer lagoons at Panguitch Lake North Campground which serves both Panguitch Lake North and South Campgrounds and the trailer dump station.” Clarify who is responsible for these lagoons.

Answer 1: Prospectus, page 30, “The permit holder is responsible for operation and maintenance of all sewer systems and trailer dump stations.”

Question 2: Prospectus, page 32, There is mention of other passes that are local passes the authorizing officer may require. Need clarification.

Answer 2: There are no local area passes.

Question 3: Prospectus, pages 32 and 33. Page 32 lists “America the Beautiful – The National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Senior Pass or Access Pass. Page 33 does not list America the Beautiful Pass.

Answer 3: The permit holder must provide a 50 percent discount to holders of Golden Age or Golden Access Passports, and America the Beautiful - The National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Senior Pass or America the Beautiful - The National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Access Pass.
